

Information for Professionals considering enrolling on the Sensory Attachment Intervention Training in Scotland 2019

Introduction - Updates to the SAI Training Pathway

Requests for training in the Sensory Attachment Intervention Model of Practice has grown exponentially in recent years from professionals across the fields of Education, Health and Social Care. Subsequently the 'SAI' Training Pathway has evolved in response to this demand, and feedback from attending professionals regarding their on-going professional development needs. From 2020 the training pathways for Therapists will be broken down into modules which currently make up the requirements for becoming an SAI accredited therapist. This will allow therapists to select modules specific to their development needs and the clinical populations they work with. Other professionals will continue to be able to go on and access the Just-Right State Programme training having completed Module One.

In 2020 this practical two-day course supersedes the 2-day SAI introductory course for professionals working with children and families. Whilst the updated content and outcomes continue to reflect those of the current 2-day course, it will take the form of 'SAI Module One' and be a requirement for all professionals. This includes Occupational Therapists, Speech Therapists and Physiotherapists whom, to-date, have been able to directly access SAI Level One for Therapists.

If Therapists complete this professional's course in 2019 it will be accredited as Module One for those wishing to proceed on to the pathway of Level accredited 1 training for Therapists without being required to repeat the course.
